TOPPENISH CITY COUNCIL **Regular Meeting Minutes** October 28, 2019

Councilmember Belton moved, seconded by Councilmember Saavedra to excuse Councilmember Oaks from the October 28, 2019 Regular Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Diane Sampson, 512 South Alder, Toppenish, shared with Council flyers promoting upcoming November community events hosted by the Toppenish Food Bank and the Toppenish Chamber of Commerce starting with Family Turkey Bingo Night on November 6 at the Food Bank, the Annual Thanksgiving and Healing Service on November 17 at the Food Bank, the Tree Lighting at Post Office Park followed with the Chamber of Commerce Lighted Parade in the downtown area on November 30.

FC Smith reported that the proposed ordinance is to amend Toppenish Municipal Code Section 8.10.070 regarding the placement of leaves in the gutters on designated days.

Councilmember Belton moved, seconded by Councilmember Thorington to adopt Ordinance 2019-08. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution 2019-41: A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Toppenish, Washington, Canceling Claims Checks.

CC Riojas noted that the proposed resolution is to authorize the cancellation of the unclaimed claims checks that are over two years old.

Councilmember Thorington moved, seconded by Councilmember Duval to adopt Resolution 2019-41. Motion carried unanimously.

Resolution 2019-42: A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Purchase Real Estate to Create a New Carlson Lift Station for the Sewer Improvements Project Phases II-IV.

CM Hoyt noted that the proposed resolution is to authorize the purchase of additional real estate for the new relocated Carlson Lift Station for the Sewer Improvements Project Phases II-IV.

Mayor Pro Tem J. Jiménez moved, seconded by Councilmember Thorington to adopt Resolution 2019-42. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor C. Jiménez reported her attendance at the AWC Cities on Tap in Yakima. She recited the AWC 2020 Legislative Priorities that include 1) adopt comprehensive set of transportation policies to provide resources and local options; 2) to fully fund the Public Works Trust Fund; 3) to create tax increment financing options for cities; 4) to preserve city fiscal health with secure funding sources; 5) support statewide medication assisted treatment services in city and regional jails by providing local flexibility; 6) to advance a watershed-based strategic plan to address local fish-blocking culverts along with state culverts; and 7) continue to pursue new resources and policies to increase affordable housing both at the state and local level.

Mayor C. Jiménez presented Liliana Pearson with flowers and a plaque from the International Institute of Municipal Clerks designating her as a Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC). Council and those present congratulated Liliana Pearson, CMC for the honor she has worked so hard to achieve.
